b) work experience, both paid and volunteer
c) anything else you would like the scholarship committee to consider

2. Attach a second one-page typed essay (double-spaced) to include the following:
a) the vocation/career you plan to pursue
b) your most important short-term and long-term goals that will make this vocation possible
c) your plans for attaining these goals, including, if applicable, activities both in and out of school
d) how your vocation will help you make a positive difference in the world
3. Attach recommendation forms from two (2) individuals (not related to you) you have asked to serve as references. One of the references must be a high school teacher or administrator, and one reference must come from the community. Reference forms must be returned to your school representative by the first Monday of April. (A follow-up on your part to ensure recommendations are submitted is wise.)
4. What post-high school program or school do you plan to attend?
5. Have you applied? Have you been admitted?
6. What credential or degree will you pursue?

A high school transcript must accompany your application, essays and references. In compliance with the Federal Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, I hereby give permission to release my transcript or my student's transcript to the Rotary Scholarship Committee.
